Compost Application Checklist

- Remove all spent crops and weeds from beds
- Decide on method: top-dress, sheet mulch, or planting hole mix
- Apply 1–2 inches of finished compost
- If using sheet mulch, layer cardboard/newspaper, compost, then straw/leaves
- Water in thoroughly after application
- Mulch over compost to retain moisture and protect soil



Best Compost Types for Autumn

- Finished home compost (dark, crumbly, earthy smell)
- Worm castings for nutrient boost
- Composted manure (aged at least 6 months)
- Mushroom compost in small amounts for brassicas
- Municipal compost (verify it's organic-certified if possible)



Pest & Problem Prevention Tips

- Avoid fresh compost near seedlings—it can burn roots
- Balance dense compost layers with dry material like straw
- Encourage worms by keeping compost slightly moist
- Watch for sowbugs or earwigs and adjust layering
